DIAGNOSTIC RADIOLOGIC TECHNICIAN-OBJECTIVE CLASSIFICATION SPECIFICATION

I. INTRODUCTION

A. <u>Purpose of This Classification Specification</u>

This classification specification is the basic authority under Wis. Admin. Code ER 2.04 for making classification decisions relative to present and future positions performing technical diagnostic radiology duties. This classification specification is not intended to identify every duty, which may be assigned to positions, but is intended to serve as a framework for classification decision making in this occupational area.

Classification decisions must be based on the "best fit" of the duties within the existing classification structure. The "best fit" is determined by the majority (i.e., more than 50%) of the work assigned to and performed by the position when compared to the class concepts and definition of this specification or through other methods of position analysis. Position analysis defines the nature and character of the work through the use of any or all of the following: definition statements; listing of areas of specialization; representative examples of work performed; allocation patterns of representative positions; job evaluation guide charts, standards or factors; statements of inclusion and exclusion; licensure or certification requirements; and other such information necessary to facilitate the assignment of positions to the appropriate classification.

B. Inclusions

The technical positions in this classification are located within a state institution and perform diagnostic radiologic procedures.

C. Exclusions

Excluded from this classification are the following types of positions:

- 1. Positions which meet the statutory definition(s) of supervisor and/or management as defined in Wis. Stats. 111.81(19) and (13) as administered and interpreted by the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission.
- 2. All other positions, which are more appropriately, identified by other classification specifications.

D. <u>Entrance Into This Classification</u>

Employees enter positions within this classification by competition.

II. DEFINITION

Positions perform diagnostic radiology under general supervision. Positions are responsible for performing standard radiographic examinations such as chest, abdomen, spine and extremity x-rays. Positions utilize patient immobilization devices as needed, process images with digital equipment, and censor images obtained for clarity and adequacy. Positions perform routine cleaning of all imaging equipment, schedule routine preventive maintenance, and keep inventory of supplies.

III. QUALIFICATIONS

The qualifications required for these positions will be determined at the time of recruitment. Such determinations will be made based on an analysis of the goals and worker activities performed and by an identification of the education, training, work, or other life experience which would provide reasonable assurance that the knowledge and skills required upon appointment have been acquired.

IV. ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

This classification was created effective April 3, 2016 and announced in Bulletin DPM-0422-CC/SC to describe technical positions which perform diagnostic radiologic procedures in a state institution. Positions in this classification were formally classified within the Diagnostic Radiological Technician classification series, which was abolished in bulletin DPM-0413-CC/SC.

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
