PSYCHOLOGIST INTERN - LEVEL II - LTE

I. CLASS DESCRIPTION

Definition:

Positions allocated to this Limited Term Employment (LTE) classification will function as a trainee during the second six months of a twelve month clinical psychology intern program. Trainees will continue to be given a variety of assignments in psychological assessment and psychotherapy, with more time devoted to clinical consultation to assist them in acquiring the desired level of competence in these primary clinical skills. Trainees will exercise greater autonomy in making psychological diagnoses, conducting intake interviews and using projective and objective personality, intellectual, and neuropsychological tests. Employees in this classification will be assigned more complex cases requiring more sophisticated psychological skills. Trainees will conduct marital and family therapy and provide in-service training to other staff members. Work is performed under the direction of one or more licensed psychologists, receiving overall direction from the director of psychology or the Psychologist Intern Training Director.

Employees will continue to be provided with a combination of formal seminars and in-service training to assist them in acquiring the desired level of competence in the primary clinical skills.

Employees in the Department of Corrections will be reassigned to clinical placements to provide a variety of experience in assessment, intervention and consultation. Employees in the Department of Health Services will be assigned to inpatient and outpatient rotations to provide the broadest range of experience.

II. QUALIFICATIONS

Psychologist interns must have successfully completed the first six months of a twelve month intern program, and continue to be enrolled in an accredited graduate program working towards a doctorate in Clinical, Counseling or School Psychology.

III. ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

The Psychologist Intern classifications were created effective March 6, 1994 and announced in Bulletin CC/SC-08. The specification was modified effective June 30, 2013 and announced in Bulletin OSER-0327-MRS/SC to describe current usage of the classification.
