PSYCHOLOGIST INTERN - LEVEL I - LTE

I. CLASS DESCRIPTION

Definition:

Positions allocated to this Limited Term Employment (LTE) classification will function as a trainee during the first six months of a twelve month clinical psychology intern program. Trainees will be given a variety of assignments in psychological assessment, psychotherapy, and clinical consultation to assist them in acquiring the desired level of competence in these primary clinical skills. Trainees will make psychological diagnoses, conduct intake interviews and use projective and objective personality, intellectual, and neuropsychological tests. Employees in this classification will be assigned selected cases for psychological assessment, and will work with clients on both an individual and group therapy basis. Work is performed under the intensive direction of one or more licensed psychologists, receiving overall direction from the director of psychology or the Psychologist Intern Training Director.

Employees will be provided with a combination of formal seminars and in-service training to assist them in acquiring the desired level of competence in the primary clinical skills.

Employees in the Department of Corrections will be assigned to clinical placements to provide a variety of experience in assessment, intervention and consultation. Employees in the Department of Health Services will be assigned to inpatient and outpatient rotations to provide the broadest range of experience.

II. QUALIFICATIONS

Psychologist interns must currently be enrolled in an accredited graduate program working towards a doctorate in Clinical, Counseling or School Psychology.

III. ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

The Psychologist Intern classifications were created effective March 6, 1994 and announced in Bulletin CC/SC-08. The specification was modified effective June 30, 2013 and announced in Bulletin OSER-0327-MRS/SC to describe current usage of the classification.
